After 1606-1607, Shakespeare wrote fewer plays, and none are attributed to him after 1613 His last three plays were collaborations, probably with John Fletcher, who succeeded him as the house playwright for the King's Men Shakespeare died on 23 April 1616 and was survived by his wife and two daughters
