EPIC THEATRE AND BRECHT German Epic Theatre, and especially the works of Brecht (1898 - 1956) can be divided into two main sections The first section includes the early words of Brecht, like Baal (1923), A Man's a Man (1926) and the famous Threepenny Opera (1928) Brecht's early thoughts on Epic theatre come from Piscator

Brecht conceived the alienation effect not only as a specific aesthetic program but also as a political mission of the theatre Inspired by the philosophies of GWF Hegel and Karl Marx, Brecht regarded his method as a way of helping spectators understand the complex nexuses of historical development and societal relationships

Brecht's passionate belief that theatre should not only reflect the world but, more importantly, change it, was the most important theme of his work In direct contradiction to the popular genre of Naturalism, Brecht used his theories of Epic Theatre to achieve change and create the type of theatre he felt could make a difference

BRECHT'S EPIC THEATRE: THEORY AND PRACTICE Of the three terms Brecht most frequently used to characterize his theatre - epic, dialectic and non-Aristotelian - the last clearly indicates Aristotle's account of tragedy as the starting-point for any attempt to understand or formulate the contrasting nature of Brecht's own dramatic theory and practice

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that ideology for world historical development to occur and the relation of theory to praxis Brecht also left behind two collections of his private writing, both of which are available in English The first is a diary (Brecht, Ramthun & Willett, 1979) written just after Brecht's experience as a medic in World War I which covers the years 1920-22
