Rome, Italy, ca 175 CE Bronze, approx 11' 6" high Equestrian portrait of Charlemagne or Charles the Bald, from Metz, France, ninth century Bronze,

originally gilt, 9 1/2" high Justinian as world conqueror, mid-sixth century Ivory, 1' 1 1/2" X 10 1/2" Charlemagne ordered the transfer of an equestrian
