### **Guidelines for Identifying Visual Perceptual Problems in ...**

A child with visual perceptual problems may be diagnosed with a visual processing disorder. He/she may be able to easily read an eye chart (acuity) but have difficulty organizing and making sense of visual information. In fact, many children with visual processing disorders have good acuity (ie, 20/20 vision).
