In 1093, the Byzantine emperor asked for help against Muslim Turks They were threatening to conquer Constantinople Pope Urban II urged the leaders of Western Europe to begin a holy war—a Crusade He wanted Christians to gain control of Jerusalem and the entire Holy Land Both knights

Later Crusades - Children's Crusade ANATOLIA The crusades to the Middle East continued for another 100 years Some crusades were popular movements of poor people rather than organized military campaigns In 1212, for example, tens of thousands of peasant children from France and Germany marched in a "Children's Crusade"

crusades, certain generalizations are ubiquitous, especially the claim that Byzantines could not comprehend the crusades because they themselves had no notion of holy war Yet most Byzantine authors do not seem to me to manifest total incomprehension of holy war They criticize specific features of crusade, but not its central premise :
